Reading: Mark 2:1-12

A few days later, when Jesus again entered Capernaum, the people heard that he had come home. ² They gathered in such large numbers that there was no room left, not even outside the door, and he preached the word to them. ³ Some men came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. ⁴ Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus by digging through it and then lowered the mat the man was lying on. ⁵ When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralyzed man, "Son, your sins are forgiven."

⁶ Now some teachers of the law were sitting there, thinking to themselves, ⁷ "Why does this fellow talk like that? He's blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?"

⁸ Immediately Jesus knew in his spirit that this was what they were thinking in their hearts, and he said to them, "Why are you thinking these things? ⁹ Which is easier: to say to this paralyzed man, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up, take your mat and walk'? ¹⁰ But I want you to know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." So he said to the man, ¹¹ "I tell you, get up, take your mat and go home." ¹² He got up, took his mat and walked out in full view of them all. This amazed everyone and they praised God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

Sermon Notes—Sunday 23rd February Miracles – the healing of the paralysed man

Mark Chapter 2 is all about the Pharisee's opposition to Jesus. On 4 occasions in this chapter, they find fault with how Jesus and his disciples behave.

Read Mark 2:1-12

The 4 friends demonstrated 'their faith' by doing everything they could to bring the paralysed man to Jesus. They had complete faith that Jesus could heal him and nothing was going to stop them. They serve as an example to us.

- Do you have such faith in Jesus to do everything you possibly can to bring your friends to him? Would you do something as crazy and socially unacceptable as making a hole in someone's roof, if that is what it took? Have you ever done such a thing?
- P.U.S.H (Pray Until Something Happens) where do you need to persevere in prayer and keep pressing on towards Jesus?
- Right from the outset, how does Jesus demonstrate his love and care for this man? Physical healing isn't this man's greatest need. It isn't our greatest need either. Having our sins forgiven is of far greater importance because it is our sins that separate us from God, deny us eternal life and bring us under God's just wrath. In forgiving this man's sin, Jesus gives him a far greater gift than physical healing.
- Why was this declaration of sins forgiven so potentially explosive?
- The teachers of the law were correct in their thinking that only God can forgive sins (Micah 7:18) so why were they unable to accept what Jesus was revealing about himself?
- Why did Jesus use the term 'Son of Man' about himself and how would that be received by his hearers?
- Jesus is often questioned about his authority in the gospel accounts. As well as in his authority to heal, what other ways do we see Jesus' authority demonstrated?
- What authority has he delegated to his followers (Matthew 28:18, Mark 3:14, Luke 10:19)? How does that encourage you/ frighten you?

Jesus bringing physical healing to the man reveals that the initial gift of forgiveness was genuine. Since Jesus can do the visible miracle (heal the paralytic man), it demonstrates that he has the authority to do the invisible miracle (forgive sins). Why is that such good news for us?

Note the response of the people v12. Are you constantly amazed by Jesus?

Pray for one another to be refreshed in our knowledge and understanding of who Jesus is and the forgiveness he won for us at so great a cost.
