## Sermon Notes Sunday 29th March

## Miracles - Feeding of the 5000

Read John 6:1-13

When John wrote his account of the life of Jesus every detail had significance.

• What do you think was the significance of mentioning 'the Passover was near'?

All the gospel writers include this miracle in their accounts (Matthew 14:13, Mark 6:30, Luke 9:10) and they mention the place where they landed as being, 'a solitary place, a remote place'. The circumstances of our lives today can deplete our emotional tank of well-being.

• In what ways might you feel you are in a spiritual or emotional wilderness?

Jesus was with these thousands of people in this remote place as he was with the disciples in the boat on the storm on the lake.

• Where do you think he is if you are feeling in a 'remote place'?

Philip and Andrew both saw the same reality – thousands of hungry people but their mindset was very different. Philip was mathematically calculating the cost of feeding so many people, Andrew found a boy with his packed lunch.

- How does our mindset affect the way we see things?
- What does Paul teach about exercising control over our thoughts (Col 3:2, Romans 12:2, 2 Corinthians 10:5) and how might this be particularly applicable in this current crisis?

Jesus knew what he was going to do. Read John 6:32-36, 51 and share on the deeper significance of his provision.

- What does the conclusion of this event suggest about the generosity of God?
- How does being reminded of God's love, provision and generosity encourage you at this time?

Share together your reflections and thoughts with other members of your group either through social media, by phone call or email and pray for one another in order to encourage and stand with each other as we exercise resilience in these testing times.

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
